

CSHA - RIDE FOR THE CURE - 2007

RULES OF ENTRY

1. All competitors must have a current Alberta Equestrian Federation membership.
2. Riders are considered Juniors if they are aged 17 or under as of January 1, 2007.
3. All Junior entries must have parent or guardian signature to compete
4. All competitors must sign a waiver form to compete.
5. Horses are classified as over 14.2hh and Ponies are 14.2hh and under.
6. Classes can be combined or eliminated at the show committee's discretion; class fee will be refunded if a class is eliminated.
7. A copy of your horse's CSHA Registration is required to be considered for the CSH High Point Show Award.
8. Dogs must be leashed and under control at all times.
9. Any horse that is unsound or is out of control in a class will be excused from the class.
10. Entry fees will only be refunded upon receipt of a Veterinary Certificate within three days of the show.
11. Please check all your entries and read all class descriptions.
12. Leigh Ritchie and Terri Hunka will be available to interpret Rules and Regulations.
13. Ribbons awarded for 1st to 6th placing.
- 14. Wearing pink is strongly encouraged!**

English Day

- If you are entering class 6, please indicate your partner on the Entry Form.
- CSA hard hats with chin straps and boots are required for all classes

Western Day

- If you are entering class 11, please indicate your partner on your Entry form.
- Western hats, boots and long sleeved shirts must be worn in all Western classes.
- A groom is allowed for class 15.

High Point Awards – Classes Eligible:

Western – Junior – Classes – 1, 3, 5, 13

Western – Senior – Classes – 2, 4, 6, 14

English – Junior – Classes – 1, 3, 12, 14

English – Senior – Classes – 2, 4, 13, 15

Canadian Sport Horse High Point Award – All classes on both days are eligible.

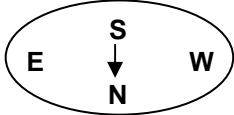

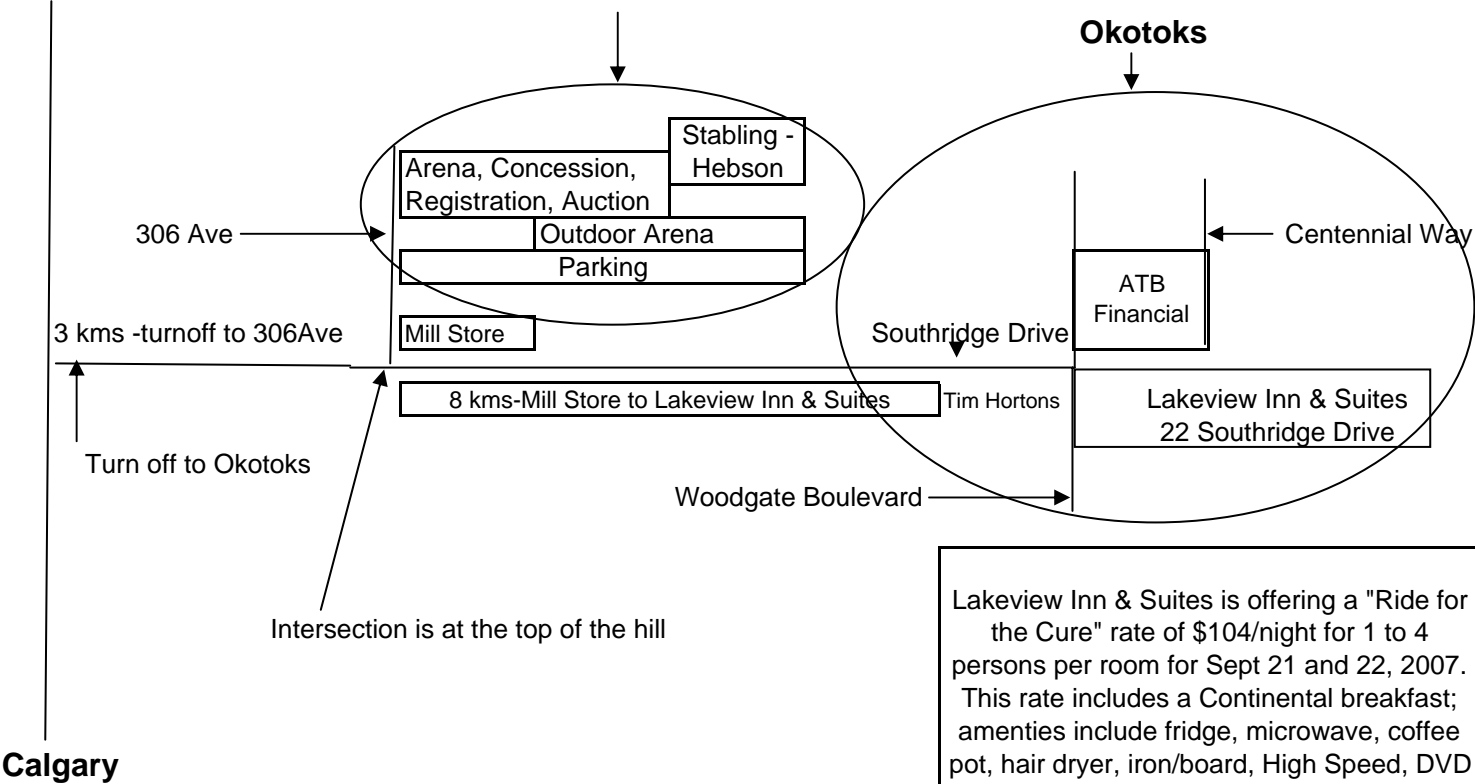

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

1. Basic Seat Equitation – Junior
Basic seat of rider judged at the walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring; judge may ask for individual work.
2. Basic Seat Equitation – Senior
Basic seat of rider judged at the walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring; judge may ask for individual work.
3. English Pleasure – Junior
Horses or ponies ridden by a junior rider at the walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring on a loose rein; suitability of horse to rider and confirmation to be considered.
4. English Pleasure – Senior
Horses or ponies ridden by a senior rider at the walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring on a loose rein; suitability of horse to rider and confirmation to be considered.
5. Open Dressage Suitability
Horses and ponies should be ridden in a frame suitable for a dressage prospect at the walk, trot and canter; some lengthening of gaits may be required.
6. Open Pairs Class – double entry fee
Horse or pony and rider appointments count in the placing of this class; unison and manners at all 3 gaits, both ways of the ring.
7. Open English Command Class
Commands will be called by the announcer or judge – winner to be established by executing all commands correctly.
8. Novice English Pleasure – Junior Rider – has not placed 1st or 2nd prior to January 2007
Horses or ponies ridden by a junior rider at the walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring on a loose rein; suitability of horse to rider and confirmation to be considered.
9. Novice English Pleasure – Senior Rider – has not placed 1st or 2nd prior to January 2007
Horses or ponies ridden by a senior rider at the walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring on a loose rein; suitability of horse to rider and confirmation to be considered.
10. The Pink Ribbon Special
Exclusive class for riders who are battling breast cancer or are breast cancer survivors.
11. Open Costume Class
Costumes to be judged on originality, suitability, creativity and audience appeal.

12. Hunter Hack – Junior –

Junior riders on horses or ponies, will be asked to walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring, then asked to jump two fences not exceeding 2 foot in a pattern (posted).

13. Hunter Hack – Senior

Senior riders on horses or ponies, will be asked to walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring, then asked to jump two fences not exceeding 2 foot in a pattern (posted).

CSHA NATIONAL FOAL AND YEARLING CHAMPIONSHIP

14. Hunt Seat Equitation Over Fences – Junior – Jumps to 2'

Junior riders will be judged over a suitable course of fences designed to show rider technique and control.

15. Hunt Seat Equitation Over Fences – Senior – Jumps to 2'6"

Senior riders will be judged over a suitable course of fences designed to show rider technique and control.

16. Pony Working Hunter Over Fences – Junior – Jumps to 2'3"

For ponies being judged over a suitable Hunter track of 8 fences.

17. Open Green Working Hunter Over Fences

A Hunter track of 8 fences at 2'3" for horses and ponies in their first year of jumping.

18. Open Handy Working Hunter Over Fences – Horses/Ponies

Horses or ponies judged over a more difficult Hunter track – one fence to be at a trot (18"), rest of the course is 2'6".

19. "Dog and Horse Relay" – Open

An obstacle speed class for team of dog and horse/pony; dogs jump their course first and then horse/pony – combined lowest time wins.

20. Jeopardy Jumping – Jumps set at 2'6" with designated point values

Riders are given 45 seconds to collect the most points to win – every jump must be used at least once, but no more than three times.

21. Three Bar – Open - 3 jumps set in a row at 2 strides apart

Fences set at 2'6" and will be raised by 2" and 3" increments until one rider/horse team have completed with 0 faults.
